These including ;a compassionate and reachable drug checking program, extensive population health outreach, community harm reduction, drug information and naloxone training sessions, youth focused education and prevention sessions focused on risk mitigation, food is love programming that is supported by Cranbrook food recovery and food bank and our wonderful donations from Alliance church, general public, First Babtist, just to name a few! Our Wellness Tuesdays have grown to be an incredible experience and opportunity for our clients to receive on site physician care by Doctor Ryck Shelky and his team weekly, and we cannot say enough how much this has made an impact on clients but the healthcare system itself in reduction of hospital visits, the true essence of what harm reduction is. Upcoming is our continued commitment to support the amazing peers in our community receiving paid work that fosters skills, after hours programming at our new site at the dwelling place with such amazing support from Pastor Ron Short, and our shift to providing on site point of care testing and education for HIV, HepC. Lastly my role with the mayor's task force on homelessness has deepened our role in community, supporting common ground our local encampment, but bringing a voice to the table where our anti stigma messaging can be fostered.
